Here is our standard letter that we send out upon receipt of a prov NoC. I would say that it is too early for a federal Project description. Hope this helps.

Thank you for your e-mail, related to the above-noted project.

The Canadian Environmental Assessment Act (the Act), applies to federal authorities when they contemplate certain action or decisions in relation to a project that would enable it to proceed in whole or in part. A federal environmental assessment (EA) may be required when a federal authority:

- a) is the proponent of the project;
- b) provides financial assistance to the proponent;
- c) sells, leases or otherwise disposes of federal lands; or
- d) issues a permit, licence or any other approval as prescribed in

the Law List Regulations.

If there is uncertainty as to whether the Act may also apply, the Agency can help proponents answer this question. For projects that are concurrently subject to both federal and provincial EA legislation, the Agency will act as the federal environmental assessment coordinator and facilitate the involvement of the federal authorities in a co-ordinated assessment aimed at meeting all agencies' needs simultaneously.

In order for the Agency to undertake either of these roles, it must have a project description that can be distributed to various federal authorities to determine their interest in the project while the provincial environmental assessment process is still ongoing. It is recognized that at the early stages of the planning process, there may not be much detailed information to provide. However, proponents should try to provide some information on:

the nature of the project and its location;

federal decisions which may be required, and which could enable the project to proceed in whole or in part;

whether federal funding is being contemplated or federal lands are required.

To better assist proponents, the Agency has developed an Operational Policy Statement, which provides guidance in preparing project descriptions. This is available on the Agency's website at: http://www.ceaa-acee.gc.ca/013/0002/ops ppd e.htm.

Please note that, for wind power projects in particular, one possible trigger for a federal EA is potential funding from Natural Resources Canada's (NRCan's) ecoENERGY for Renewable Power Program. Please be advised that the ecoENERGY for Renewable Power Program has recently revised its Terms and Conditions (in effect as of September 3, 2008, and available on the Program's website at www.ecoaction.gc.ca/ecorp.

Under the revised Terms and Conditions, the submission of a Notice of Project Application (NPA) is no longer sufficient for NRCan to determine if it is a Responsible Authority under the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act*. Under the new Terms and Conditions, in order for NRCan to determine if it is a Responsible Authority due to the likely provision of funds from the ecoENERGY for Renewable Power Program, a proponent must complete the first two steps of the approval process outlined in the Program's new Terms and Conditions (i.e. Notice of Project Application and Technical Project Information) and sign a contribution agreement.

For proponents who have or will be soon applying to this funding program, NRCan has requested the information outlined on the attached page be included either within the Project Description or as a separate document along with the Project Description.

Other potential triggers include permits that are occasionally necessary for watercourse crossings associated with turbine access roads or transmission lines. Although the above is not an inclusive list of all potential triggers for a federal EA for wind energy projects, they are the most common.

You may wish to take the above information into consideration when deciding whether or not to prepare and submit a federal project description to the Agency at this time.

With particular reference to wind power proposals, please note that the Agency does not play a federal coordination role if the provincial environmental assessment process is complete. If your project may still be subject to a federal environmental assessment following the completion of the provincial process, please contact the federal agency who may be required to ensure a federal assessment is carried out, such as Natural Resources Canada, Fisheries and Oceans Canada, and/or Transport Canada.

Please also note that, regardless of whether there is a federal environmental assessment required for your project, Environment Canada has a mandated interest in the potential effects of wind farms on birds and can provide comment through the provincial EA process. For more information, please refer to their guidance document "Wind Turbines and Birds" at http://www.cws-scf.ec.gc.ca/publications/eval/turb/cont_e.cfm.

Important Note: Please be aware that release of documents to the public may be part of the EA process. Information provided by you related to the EA for this project will be part of the Canadian Environmental Assessment Registry and will be made available to members of the public, if requested. A package with additional information will be provided to you upon submission of the project description. Should you provide any documents that contain confidential or sensitive information that you believe should be protected from release to the public, please contact the undersigned to obtain an Exclusion Form. This Form can be used to identify the information to be considered for exclusion from the Canadian Environmental Assessment Registry and the rationale for the exclusion.

Thank you for providing the updated project description for the proposed Ernestown Wind Park. With respect to your question of whether this project will trigger a federal environmental assessment (EA) under the Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency who will be able to assist you in determining whether any federal departments have, or are likely to, trigger an EA of the project under CEAA. Nonetheless, based on the information that you have provided about the project, I can confirm that Environment Canada would not have any obligations that would trigger a federal EA of this project under CEAA. Should any other federal department trigger a federal EA for this project, EC would likely participate as an expert Federal Authority to assist any Responsible Authorities with the assessment, in areas related to our mandates and expertise.

EC recognizes that, if not properly sited, wind energy projects have the potential to adversely affect birds through direct fatalities, disturbance/displacement, and habitat loss. To assist wind energy developers and review agencies to identify, assess, monitor and mitigate (including through siting choice) potential adverse effects of land-based wind energy projects on migratory birds, in 2007 Environment Canada's Canadian Wildlife Service developed Wind Turbines and Birds: A Guidance Document for Environmental Assessment. This document is supported by a companion document, Recommended Protocols for Monitoring Impacts of Wind Turbines on Birds. Both documents are attached to this email. If your project does require a federal EA, these documents should be consulted to assist you in addressing impacts to birds as part of the EA.

I understand that the proposed Ernestown Wind Park would be subject to Ontario's new Renewable Energy Approvals (REA) Regulation under the Green Energy and Green Economy Act. As such, I also understand the project will not be subject to the provincial EA process. Environment Canada has been working with the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and the Ontario Ministry of the Environment to define our role under the Province's new regulatory approvals process. We expect that we will be providing advice to the provincial agencies on our mandated areas of responsibility, including water quality, migratory birds and species at risk, as part of their regulatory review of wind energy projects, but has yet to be confirmed. We have also been inputting to guidance materials being prepared by provincial ministries related to impacts on wildlife and other issues. You should contact the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources for information and direction on what their requirements will be in relation to such impacts.



CBC/Radio-Canada Involvement and Requirements Concerning Wind Energy Projects

1. Introduction

CBC/Radio-Canada is seriously concerned about potential negative impacts of wind energy projects on its existing broadcasting services and wishes to ensure that any project will be developed so as to protect its services to avoid any interference. CBC/Radio-Canada needs all stakeholders' complete cooperation and involvement, throughout the planning, implementation and operation phases of the project. This document sets out what is required of stakeholders and wind energy project proponents in order to succeed in avoiding problems of interference.

Even though CBC/Radio-Canada has been notified of this wind energy project, CBC/Radio-Canada's role in the current process is limited to acknowledging the existence of the project and receiving the relative environmental assessment report. Consequently, CBC/Radio-Canada will not comment on the preliminary report and the detailed impact study, nor will it conduct analysis for the benefit of the proponent.

2. CBC/Radio-Canada's Mandate

CBC/Radio-Canada is Canada's public broadcaster. It was created and is governed by the *Broadcasting Act* and must operate in compliance with the mandate described therein.

It is of utmost importance for CBC/Radio-Canada that the quality of the reception of the broadcast signal be maintained at all times to comply with one aspect of its mandate which is that the programming should be made available throughout Canada by the most appropriate and efficient means and as resources become available for the purpose (Section 3. (1) m) (vii) of the *Broadcasting Act*).

In addition, CBC/Radio-Canada's public service programming is often seen by governmental authorities as a priority service to communicate with the population in times of crisis or for emergencies and, as such, the quality of the reception of the signal by the Canadian population is crucial.

In order to operate in accordance with its mandate, which includes the obligation to provide a signal of an acceptable quality level, CBC/Radio-Canada has spent significant public resources, by installing over the years and operating over 1350 transmitters for radio and television throughout Canada. No special funding is provided to CBC/Radio-Canada for the development of new broadcasting infrastructures or modifications to existing broadcasting infrastructures dedicated to respond to the needs, requirements and impacts of economical or regional development projects, such as wind energy projects.

The local population in any part of the country has every right to continue to receive programming from their national broadcaster using good quality "over-the-air" signals, and CBC/Radio-Canada must not be prevented from maintaining the quality that it is currently providing to such population.

3. Responsibilities of the Proponents of Wind Energy Projects

CBC/Radio-Canada strongly feels that it is the responsibility of a wind energy project proponent to protect television and radio broadcasting services in place prior to the development of its wind energy project. In order to help proponents fulfill this responsibility, CBC/Radio-Canada has listed principles that should be followed by proponents, as well as activities that must be undertaken and requirements thoroughly met to minimize the risk of negatively affecting CBC/Radio-Canada's existing services.

3.1. Principles

3.1.1. Undertake assessment of impacts on a voluntary basis

CBC/Radio-Canada expects the proponent to work with due diligence and, therefore, to undertake, on a voluntary and independent basis, the required actions listed below at item 3.2 to appropriately assess the impact of its proposed wind energy project on CBC/Radio-Canada's existing broadcasting services.

3.1.2. Hire qualified engineers and seek valid information

It is the proponent's responsibility to seek valid information and to hire, whenever necessary, a qualified engineer(s) with the relevant expertise in broadcasting to ensure that the risks to the existing broadcasting services are correctly assessed. Thus, if any document used or produced by the proponent, its employees or its consultant(s) contains erroneous assumptions, computations, analyses, or conclusions that result in damages to CBC/Radio-Canada's existing broadcasting services, the proponent and other involved parties will be accountable and ultimately liable.

3.1.3. Undertake to put mitigation solutions in place

Any and all governmental authority evaluating a proponent's wind energy project for the purpose of granting the authorizations required for its implementation should provide such authorizations conditional upon the proponent putting in place efficient mitigation solutions to ensure that the current reception quality of CBC/Radio-Canada's broadcasting services for the local population will be maintained. In addition, all proponents should fully cooperate with CBC/Radio-Canada and undertake to put in place such mitigation solutions necessary to respond to CBC/Radio-Canada's concerns, whether through a governmental authority or directly with CBC/Radio-Canada.

3.2. CBC/Radio-Canada's List of Required Action Items for Proponents

3.2.1. Project information to provide to CBC/Radio-Canada

As indicated in item 1 above, CBC/Radio-Canada's involvement in the environmental assessment process is limited to being informed of the assessment of potential interference of the proposed wind energy project on existing CBC/Radio-Canada services. For this purpose, we require the proponent to provide a brief project description including the following information:

- The total number of proposed wind turbines;
- The proposed geographical coordinates of every proposed wind turbine (NAD83 lat-long):
- A map illustrating the proposed turbine layout;
- The height of the wind turbine structure;
- The maximal length of a wind turbine blade used in the project;
- The project's schedule.

This information should be provided to CBC/Radio-Canada as soon as it is available, as well as any amendments thereafter.

3.2.2. Preliminary report as per the RABC & CanWEA Guidelines

The document, *Technical Information and Guidelines on the Assessment of the Potential Impact of Wind Turbines on Radiocommunication, Radar and Seismoacoustic System [Guidelines]* is published jointly by the RABC¹ and the CanWEA². The *Guidelines* provide all the necessary information to correctly identify the consultation zones for wind energy projects on radiocommunication, including broadcasting, radar and seismoacoustic systems. The consultation zones are the triggers for the proponent to notify the applicable authority in order to start the assessment process for the potential risk of interference.

CBC/Radio-Canada requests the proponent to prepare a preliminary report in accordance with the *Guidelines* which includes, but is not limited to, all the elements listed below:

- The computation of all of the relevant consultation zones (equations & results);
- The inventory of all of CBC/Radio-Canada's existing AM radio and FM radio broadcasting transmitters located within five kilometres of the project ³;
- The inventory of all of CBC/Radio-Canada's existing television broadcasting transmitters within 89 kilometres of the project;
- The population counts in each of the project's television consultation zones;
- For each broadcasting service type (AM, FM and television), a map showing:
 - The limits of the consultation zone, if relevant;
 - The position of all of the proposed wind turbines;
 - All the previously identified transmitters;
 - The location of every dwelling⁴;
- Proof of coordination with the authority responsible for the environmental assessment of the project, if any.

The preliminary report must be submitted to the project's environmental assessment authority⁵ responsible for the proposed wind energy project.

3.2.3. Detailed impact analysis

A. Existing Television Broadcasting Services

For television, two (2) situations require a detailed impact study:

- 1. If any receiver⁶ is located within the television consultation zone identified in the preliminary report;
- 2. If any of the proposed wind turbines is located inside the consultation zone for television broadcasting transmitters.

CBC/Radio-Canada requires the wind energy project's proponent to provide an engineering report detailing the effects of the wind turbines on the reception of CBC/Radio-Canada's television signals. Analyses provided in this report must

factor in both the static effects, such as ghosting interference, as well as the dynamic effects of the wind turbines and, finally, the combination of both phenomena. As in the preliminary report, every dwelling must be considered a receiver. Note that a qualified engineer(s), with the relevant expertise in broadcasting pursuant to the applicable provincial statutes, must undertake the study.

An outline of a typical report is attached. This outline may need to be adapted for each project. The outline also gives general information as to how other radio communication services, besides broadcasting, may be affected by wind turbine structures. The study must demonstrate that no negative impact is anticipated on the systems in place. However, if negative impact is anticipated, the proponent shall modify the proposed implementation or offer adequate mitigation measures.

B. Existing AM Radio Broadcasting Services

For AM radio broadcasting, two (2) situations require a re-radiation study:

- 1. For an omnidirectional antenna system (single tower), if any of the wind turbines is located within two kilometres of the antenna;
- 2. For a directional antenna system (multiple towers), if any of the wind turbines is located within five kilometres of the antenna.

Note that a qualified engineer(s) with the relevant expertise in broadcasting pursuant to the applicable provincial statutes must undertake the detailed impact study or re-radiation study. The study must demonstrate that no negative impact is anticipated on the systems in place. However, if negative impact is anticipated, the proponent shall modify the proposed implementation or offer adequate mitigation measures⁷.

C. Existing FM Radio Broadcasting Services

For FM radio broadcasting, one (1) situation requires a detailed impact study:

1. If any of the proposed wind turbines is located inside the consultation zone for FM broadcasting transmitters.

-

⁷ For AM broadcasting services, the mitigation measures are very complex and expensive. Thus, relocation of wind turbines is preferable.

3.2.4. Monitoring of television reception quality (pre- & post-construction measurements)

In order to assess the impacts on television reception due to the implementation and operation of wind turbines, measurements must be conducted of all of CBC/Radio-Canada's television signals in the project's area⁸ before and after the implementation of the wind turbines' structures. Measurements taken before the wind turbines' structure implementation will be used as baseline measurements to confirm the television signal quality prior to the implementation. Once the structures are erected and/or the turbines installed and operating, determination of the television picture degradation will be made more easily by comparing the post-construction measurements to the baseline measurements. In our opinion, this is the most efficient method for demonstrating the probable degradation of the television reception caused by wind turbine installation and/or operation.

3.2.5. Complaint registry

CBC/Radio-Canada believes that a wind energy project proponent has the responsibility to remedy all valid complaints from local population regarding interference caused by the implementation and/or operation of wind turbines. The mechanism that will be put in place to analyze, follow up and remedy all valid complaints shall be described by proponent and submitted to the project's responsible environmental assessment authority. CBC/Radio-Canada would appreciate receiving a copy of this submission.

3.2.6. <u>Implementation of mitigation measures</u>

CBC/Radio-Canada requests a written commitment, from the wind energy project proponent, to solve any valid interference complaints at its own expense. For television signals, this includes and is not limited to: receiving antenna replacement or payment of the installation and monthly fees for subscription to a cable or satellite television signal distribution service for the duration of the operation of the wind turbines or the existence of its supporting structure. A copy of the written commitment must be submitted directly to CBC/Radio-Canada and to the authority responsible for the environmental assessment of the project, if applicable.

3.2.7. Inform the local population

CBC/Radio-Canada requires that the wind energy project proponent inform the local population of the potential impacts on over-the-air television reception. The population should be informed of the following, ideally prior to or at the time that municipal authorization is sought, or no later than one month prior to the erection of the first structure:

- The potential negative impacts of wind turbines on the reception of television signals:
- The zones at higher risks of suffering from interference, if relevant;
- The mechanism available to log in complaints in case of interference:
- The mitigation measures available to remedy the damage;
- The proponent's commitment to remedy the damage.

This information should be provided in written form to every resident located in the vicinity of the wind energy project, but minimally to the residents located inside the television consultation zone, and to the municipal authorities.

Project's area: zones at higher risks of suffering from interference, as identified in the detailed impact study.
If a detailed impact study is not available, the measurements must be conducted within the television consultation zone identified in the preliminary report.

4. Conclusion

CBC/Radio-Canada is confident that all stakeholders and especially proponents of wind energy projects will fully cooperate with the Corporation to minimize the impacts of such projects on the broadcasting services currently provided to the local population. Local population in any part of the country has the right to receive "over-the-air" signals from CBC/Radio-Canada and any proponent with a wind energy project that may negatively affect current broadcasting services should be responsible for ensuring that efficient mitigation solutions be put in place.

Should voluntary cooperation not be possible because of a wind energy project proponent's refusal to comply with the requirements set out in this document, CBC/Radio-Canada will hold the proponent responsible for any degradation of its signal and/or reduction in the quality of the broadcasting services to the local population, as a result of the implementation and/or operation of the wind turbine(s). In any case, CBC/Radio-Canada reserves all its rights and recourses against stakeholders of the wind energy project, but believes that cooperation from the early stages of the project would allow minimizing risks of interference with CBC/Radio-Canada's over-the-air local broadcasting signals.





Cataraqui Region Conservation Authority (CRCA) staff are writing regarding your request for information for the above-noted properties located south of Millhaven Road in Loyalist Township and for the area within 120 m of the subject properties. The site was not visited.

The subject lands are bound by Millhaven Street to the north and Taylor-Kidd Boulevard to the south. Aerial photography of the area indicates that a major portion of the subject lands is used for agricultural purposes. An unnamed watercourse and its tributaries cross the site at several locations. The watercourse flows to the southeast and eventually drains into Parrott's Bay. A rail line crosses the site in an east-west direction. Significant woodlands identified in the Central Cataraqui Region Natural Heritage Study (CCRNHS) (CRCA, 2006) cover the central portion of the property adjacent to the rail line. Small pockets of Contributory Woodlands are also located on the site adjacent to significant woodlands (see attached map).

Millhaven Creek flows along the north side of Millhaven Road, within 120 m of the subject lands. An unevaluated wetland is located along Millhaven Creek, north of Millhaven Road.

The subject lands are currently designated 'Agricultural' and 'Rural' in the Loyalist Township Official Plan and are zoned 'Prime Agriculture' (PA) and 'Rural' (RU) in the Zoning By-law. The land adjacent to the watercourse and its tributaries are designated and zoned 'Environmental Protection.' The significant woodlands have an 'Environmentally Sensitive' overlay in the Official Plan.

Watercourses

Unnamed Watercourse and Tributaries

A watercourse and its tributaries flow through the site and are identified as Environmental Protection Areas on Schedule B of the Official Plan. The Environmental Protection Area designation applies to land within 30 m of the highwater mark of a waterbody for which there is no floodplain mapping. Policy 4.2.4.1 of the Official Plan states that an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) may be required for development applications on or near lands designated Environmental Protection. In this case, the flooding hazard component of the Environmental Protection designation could be evaluated by a qualified hydrologic professional, should development be proposed in this area.

Flooding Hazard

The CRCA does not have engineered 1:100 year floodplain mapping for the watercourse or its tributaries. The CRCA, in accordance with Section 2.2 of the Provincial Policy Statement and under Ontario Regulation 148/06: Development, Interference with Wetlands, and Alterations to Shorelines and Watercourses, restricts alteration to and development near or across a watercourse. The CRCA requires that future development be located a minimum distance of 30 m from the average high water mark or top of bank of a waterbody when the elevation of the regulatory floodplain is unknown. Similarly, Section 5.4.6 (d) of the Loyalist Township Official Plan and Section 4.11 (c) of the Zoning By-law require new buildings or structures to be set back 30 m from the high water mark where a floodplain has not been defined. In addition, Section 4.11 (b) of the Zoning By-law requires a 15 m setback from lands zoned Environmental Protection.

Erosion Hazard

Based on aerial photography, the watercourse and the tributaries appear to be meandering watercourses. 'Meandering' often occurs under conditions such as heavy or rapid runoff or spring snow melt, and results in changes to flooding and erosion patterns. The erosion hazard limit or meander belt allowance is defined as the maximum extent to which a water channel migrates over time. The Natural Hazard Training Manual (Ministry of Natural Resources, 1997) defines the meander belt allowance as 20 times the bankfull channel width for a particular section of a creek. Ontario Regulation 148/06 applies to lands within the meander belt allowance and 15 m beyond the meander belt on either side. The extent of the regulated area will be determined at the time of a site inspection when a formal application is made.

Water Ouality

Section 5.4.6 (g) of the Official Plan of Loyalist Township indicates that a natural vegetative buffer strip of 15 m should be maintained adjacent to the edge of a watercourse to filter pollutants. The Official Plan does not permit clear cutting of trees within this buffer area. The CRCA Planning Policy also requires a minimum 30 m setback from the annual high water line of a waterbody for development adjacent to all waterbodies in order to preserve their hydrological and biological functions.

Millhaven Creek

Millhaven Creek flows on the north side of Millhaven Road within 120 m of the subject lands. The regulatory floodplain of Millhaven Creek at this location varies between 102.6 m and 103.3 m GSC. The CRCA, under Ontario Regulation 148/06 requires that development and site alteration be setback a minimum distance of 5 m from the regulatory floodplain of Millhaven Creek.

Unevaluated Wetland

An unevaluated wetland is located outside of the subject lands, but within a distance of 120 m. The wetland is located along the south side of Millhaven Creek, and north of Millhaven Road. The CRCA, under Ontario Regulation 148/06 requires that development and site alteration be setback a minimum of 30 m from the unevaluated wetland.

Significant Woodlands

The Central Cataraqui Region Natural Heritage Study (CCRNHS) (CRCA, 2006) identifies areas of 'Significant Woodlands' and 'Contributory Woodlands' present on the subject property. The woodled area was identified as significant based on its area. Pockets of contributory woodlands directly abut with the area identified as significant woodlands.

Policy 2.1.4 of the Provincial Policy Statement (2005) does not permit development and site alteration in significant woodlands unless negative impacts can be mitigated. Policy 5.4.7.1 (f) of the Official Plan for Loyalist Township requires that "development be carried out in a manner that encourages the protection and management of woodlands," and that development applications affecting significant woodlands be "accompanied by a strategy maximizing the woodland areas to be protected." The CRCA requests that every effort be taken to protect the Significant and Contributory Woodlands. The CRCA recommends that an environmental impact assessment and a tree preservation plan be prepared should development be proposed in Significant Woodlands.

Endangered and Threatened Species

Wildlife within the creeks and wooded areas may contain species that are protected under Provincial and Federal Endangered Species legislation. CRCA staff suggest that you contact the Ministry of Natural Resources to discuss obligations/restrictions that may need to be followed. The MNR contact is Todd Norris at the Kingston Area office at (613) 531-5728.

Summary

The property is subject to Ontario Regulation 148/06: Development, Interference with Wetlands, and Alterations to Shoreline and Watercourses. Permits will be required for any proposed development and site alterations within 30 m of the average high water mark or top of bank of any watercourse on the subject property and for any in-water works, or within 15 m of the meander belt allowance of any watercourse, or within 15 m of the regulatory floodplain of

Millhaven Creek, or within 30 m of the unevaluated wetland. Permits will also be required for any proposed development and site alteration within 30 m of any unmapped waterbodies/wetlands found at the time of a site inspection when a formal application is made. CRCA staff will review the application in light of Ontario Regulation 148/06 and CRCA policies before deciding to issue or refuse the permit.

We trust that the above has addressed your inquiry. Please note that these comments reflect our understanding, at the time of writing, of the best available data, applicable policies and regulations. Changes in one or more of these factors may influence our comments. As noted previously, the site was not visited.

CRCA Fee

The CRCA charges fees for inquiries; the current fee for a property inquiry without a site visit is \$120. We request that payment of this fee be submitted to this office at your earliest convenience.



I've attached our draft plan and culvert design is nearly complete. There are potentially 3 water crossings north of the CN rail line where we plan to build access roads and one south of the CN line where we plan to raise a power line but will not be building a road.

Questions:

What are the applicable fees for water crossing permit(s)?
 (I would think that we need to apply for a Group 4 permit and the Plan

Review Service doesn't seem to apply)

- The fee would be a group 2 in your case.
- 2. Do we need a crossing permit for the power line-only crossing south of the CN line?

It would best to include all works around water under the single permit application (keeps fees to a minimum as well - we charge based on the largest of the projects, but all other projects under that are included).

3. I believe you read our water body assessment written in 2010. Although we need to update the layouts, was the information in that report sufficient to support our application? What additional information would the CRCA be interested in?

The waterbody assessment report is part of the REA process, information contained within it can add to the information available to include with an application under Ontario Regulation 148/06, but the application is separate and does not rely upon the assessment report.

4. Are there any concern about effects on fish habitat in this area?

Fish habitat will be addressed as part of our review, it is not anticipated that there will be any concerns that cannot be mitigated through design or implementation of best construction practices.

Good afternoon, Mr. Daoust,

Thanks for providing a link to the project web site and a sample of the form of agreement which you would like Trans-Northern to enter into with the wind park proponent.

I would first point out that Trans-Northern's petroleum products pipeline has been in its present location since 1952, and that its 18.29 metre wide right-of-way is created by easements registered on title to the various parcels at issue.

Trans-Northern's is an interprovincial pipeline subject to federal regulation... pipeline operations must comply with the National Energy Board (NEB) Act, the Onshore Pipeline Regulations, CSA Z662 and other applicable regulations, codes and standards. Any facility crossing of the pipeline right-of-way (including any excavation greater than 300 mm in depth) must meet technical design and drawing requirements and be specifically authorized in accordance with the Pipeline Crossing Regulations. This authorization would usually be a crossing permit issued by Trans-Northern (perhaps involving a registered crossing agreement), but in some cases an order issued by the NEB. Any construction or excavation work within 30 metres of the pipeline right-of-way must also satisfy s. 112 of the NEB Act, which establishes notification and safety requirements for working in that zone.

In the circumstances, I am not sure why Trans-Northern would find it appropriate to enter into a "Mutual Co-Existence Agreement" which appears to be drafted for situations in which wind farm leases overlap oil and gas well leases, and which appears mainly to reinforce legal liabilities the parties would already have in law.

Trans-Northern does not object to development proposals near the pipeline providing they will not endanger the pipeline or interfere with access for purposes of pipeline construction, inspection, maintenance, monitoring, or emergency response. According to the plan on your web site the pipeline right-of-way lies in the northeast part of the study area, fairly close to residences fronting on Millhaven Road. The plan does not indicate where the 4 to 6 wind turbines are to be situated within the study area, but I understand from Mr. Wright they are to be quite some distance from the right-of-way. I have seen various suggested setback distances in the literature, often related to the total height of the turbines, with factors of 1.0 to 1.5 times total height (turbine hub blade length); however, in some jurisdictions, I have also seen suggested nominal setbacks of 250m, 500m or more from residences, travelled highways, utility lines, etc. What setback are you presently considering from the pipeline right-of-way, and is this a regulatory requirement based in science / engineering?

As mentioned, Trans-Northern is interested in protecting the pipeline and maintaining the integrity of its 18.29 m wide right-of-way. Some of its easement agreements are "blanket easements" affecting whole land parcels rather than defined rights-of-way. However, where a suitable legal description is made available, Trans-Northern may be prepared to release its interest in lands beyond the right-of-way (e.g. Parts 1 and 3, Plan 29R-3335) while conserving its interest in the right-of-way itself (e.g. Pt. 2, Plan 29R-3335). Would that help to address concerns about co-existence?

Attached are some leaflets describing the pipeline system and safety requirements for working nearby. Also attached are excerpts of the Crossing Guidelines containing technical and drawing requirements and outlining application procedures. If there is any concern about your project meeting these requirements, it should be addressed early in the planning process.

I hope this information will be helpful. Please be in touch if I may clarify or expand upon the discussion, and let me know how the project unfolds.


