**WORKSHOP #1**

Workshop #1 was held on May 2nd, 2012 to provide participants with an opportunity to comment on material presented in Open House #1, including preliminary baseline conditions, proposed Work Plans, and preliminary evaluation criteria and indicators. The Workshop #1 summary report is now available on the project website (http://brec.wm.com) for review.

**QUESTION & ANSWER SESSION**

A Question & Answer (Q&A) Session was held on June 27th, 2012 to present to the public information on hydrogeology, landfill liners, landfill gas, and the BREC Environmental Assessment (EA). Q&A Session materials, including copies of the presentations, the record of the Q&A, and the event summary report, are now available on the project website (http://brec.wm.com) for review.

WM is undertaking an EA for a new landfill footprint at the proposed BREC. The BREC would be an integrated waste management facility that would include the following components:

- Material Recycling Facility
- Residential Diversion Facility
- Landfill-Gas-to-Energy Facility
- New Landfill Footprint
- Electronic Waste Handling Facility
- Organics Processing Facility
- Construction & Demolition Material Facility



The new landfill footprint is the only component of the BREC that requires EA approval under the Environmental Assessment Act (EAA). The EA will be conducted in accordance with the ToR, approved by the Minister of the Environment. The proposed location of the BREC and the new landfill footprint component is within the Town of Greater Napanee in the area shown on the map below. The purpose of the EA is to study the potential environmental effects (positive or negative) of the proposed new landfill footprint on the environment. Key aspects of the EA process include: consultation with the public, Aboriginal communities and government agencies; consideration and evaluation of alternatives; and, assessment and management of potential environmental effects. Conducting an EA promotes good environmental planning before decisions are made about a proposal.

Members of the public, Aboriginal communities, government agencies, and other interested persons are encouraged to actively participate in the EA process.

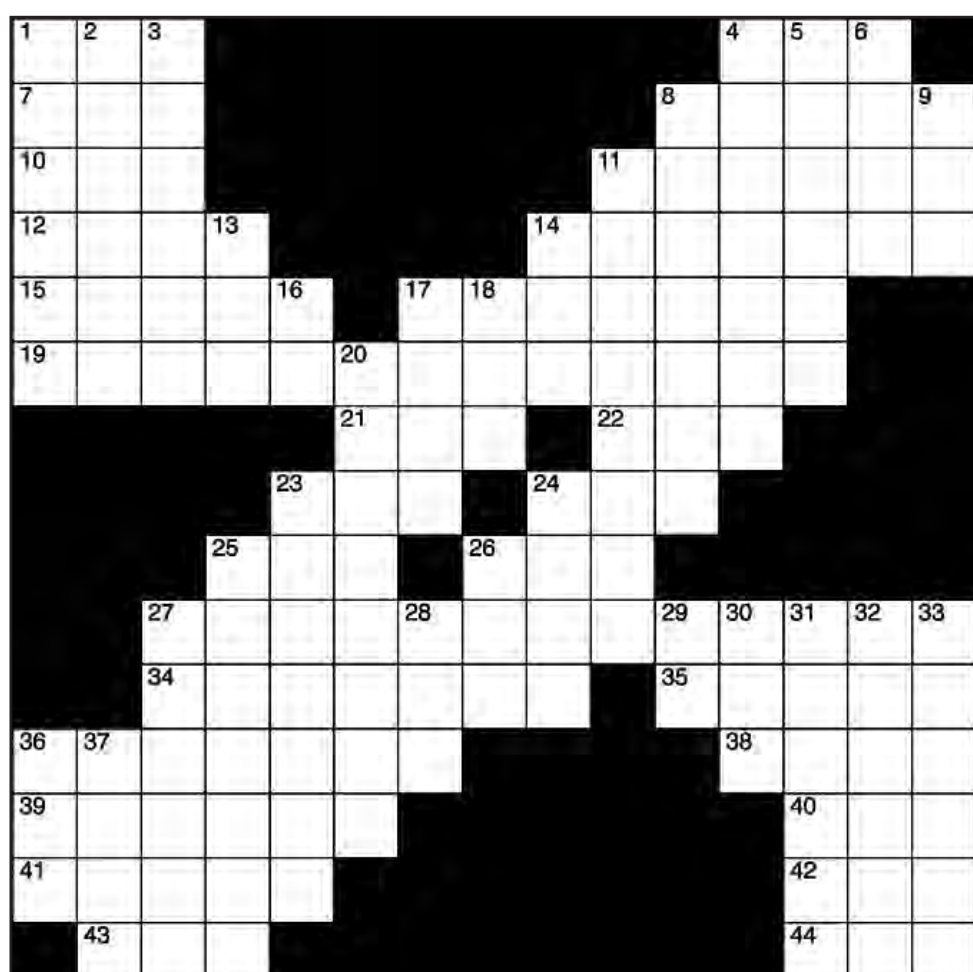

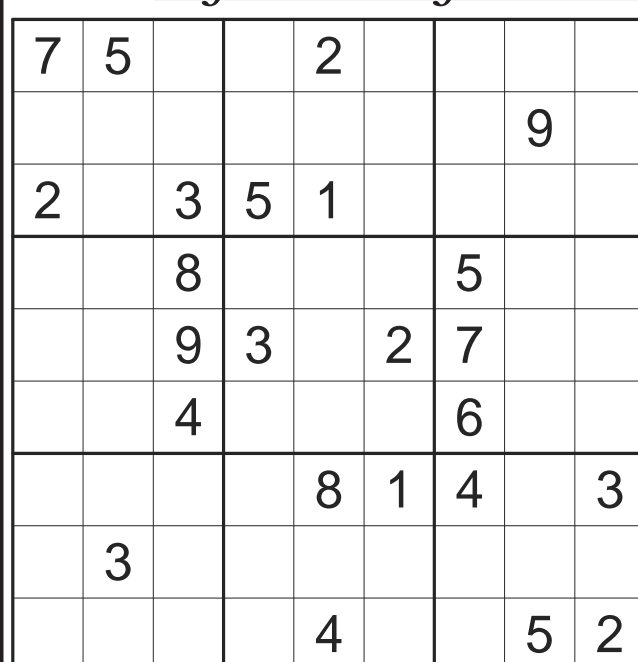

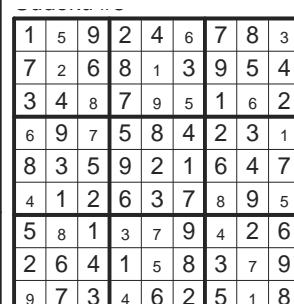

# New survey focuses on downtown ideas

The Napanee Business Improvement Area and Core Area Advisory Committee are going right to the source to create an ideal downtown.

They've teamed to create an online survey and are inviting local business owners to offer their two cents' worth.

"It's just a variety of things," Olivia Mills of the BIA says of the survey's questions. "If there is something that you don't feel is relevant to your business then you can skip it. At the end there's a comment box for anything you feel is important that we may not have asked."

The short survey asks shopkeepers questions such as what do they find helpful when working downtown, what support they'd like to see from the municipality and what kind of help are they aware of that exists right now.

The survey is posted online at [www.surveymonkey.com/s/IdealDowntown](http://www.surveymonkey.com/s/IdealDowntown) and will continue to be until July 25. When it was first released members of the committees handed out cards to all local businesses, encouraging them to log on and give their responses. So far the response has been low, which is why Mills is urging business owners to take a few minutes to fill it out. Each response is highly valued and anonymous. They're looking for both positive and negative feedback to see what's working and what's not.

"It's for strategic planning," Mills says of the results. "(The answers will be used when considering) how to make the downtown better for businesses that are here and also how to make it more appealing for businesses that may consider coming to Napanee."

First-hand data from those who run downtown stores on a daily basis will provide valuable input as the BIA and CAAC move forward with their plans for the coming months.

# Motorcycle rally to roll into Napanee

A motorcycle invasion will hit Napanee Aug. 3 and 4 as the first Ride With the Pack Bike Rally rolls through town, marking one of the biggest convoys to ever hit the county.

There's nothing to fear though, as these bikers have a heart of gold; they're riding to raise money for charity. Hosted by Trenton's Juno Unit Canadian Army Veterans, the ride will feature several of Canada's finest uniformed men and women. "I do know we have people coming from Nova Scotia and British Columbia," said Pavel 'Bear' Mokros, member of the Juno Unit CAV and event organizer. "The ones coming from across Canada are all from the Canadian Army Veterans, but there are also many local clubs that are also going to show up."

Not everyone in the CAV served their country though, as civilian supporters of the group are welcome. "We come from all walks of life," said Mokros. "It was started by veterans to support veterans. (The club includes veterans) right from Second World War dispatch riders to current 20-year-olds that got into the military this year."

Some of the classic bikes that will be on hand will have been used in military service.

Money from registration as well as 'biker games' that will take place at the Strathcona Paper Centre will go towards ICROSS Canada, Children's Wish and L&A's Interval House. ICROSS Canada assists the poorest of the poor living in Africa, Children's Wish helps terminal children live out their dream and Interval House is a local women's shelter.

Riders will arrive on the afternoon of Aug. 3 for a meet and greet, camp at the SPC and then hit the road Saturday morning. # Closer look at 'tactile gardens'

*"I know that if odour were visible, as colour is, I'd see the summer garden in rainbow clouds."*  
~Robert Bridges, *Testament of Beauty*

Dinner is only 30 minutes away and I have not thought about food for the briefest moment. I brush a naked hand through a rosemary plant sitting in a container on the back patio and instantly I can hardly wait for a plate full of food. What just happened is not a miracle; it is a common, everyday experience during the gardening season that is generally taken for granted.

Whether it is appetite stimulation, clearing the sinuses with a whiff of menthol scented mint, or enjoying the feel of a Lamb's Ear on the skin of your finger tips, the results always generate a heightened sense of the green, growing world around you. Indeed, we do take many plants for granted.

Instead of leaving these tactile encounters in the garden to chance, I have another suggestion. Why not intentionally plant scented plants and plants that beg you to reach out and touch them in your garden scheme?

#### Best Place

Create a garden space nearest the area that you

enjoy sitting or areas where you frequent in the garden. The essential oils of rosemary and lavender are activated when you walk past and brush against them. Other plants provide an abundance of scent without any help from you.

Old fashioned nicotine, heliotrope and stocks, can provide an almost overwhelming scent in the garden or on the porch and patio when planted in containers. This is especially true in the evenings when the air is quiet and the plants release their scent in an attempt to attract night flying pollinators.

Allow your flowering, highly scented plants to become dry and the perfume that they produce is intensified further. Planting against a sunny, south-facing wall increases the intensity of the scents. Conversely I recommend that you avoid planting scented annuals and perennials in the shade, which minimizes the scent that they produce.

Different plants produce nectar that is highly scented at different times of the year. Early in spring I plant hyacinths near the entrance to our home to greet us with a scent that says, "Hello spring!". This time of year my Confederate Jasmine,

gardenia, and honeysuckle flowers provide the same, warm greeting.

#### Touch me!

When you were a child, perhaps you can remember being told to touch a rather innocuous, finely leaved tropical plant that curled up its' leaves when you ran your fingers over them. It was fun and it gave us a basic understanding that plants indeed have their own sensitivities. The plant was mimosa and it is easy to grow outdoors this time of year as a tropical. It is not nearly as attractive as it is fun. Introduce your kids or grand children to it and watch for the reaction!

Other plants that beg to be touched include Lamb's Ears (stachys), a reliable perennial (zone 4) that produces lots of yellow flowers in the spring and an abundance of soft, smooth, furry leaves that feel just like the ears of a lamb.

Scented geraniums tempt you to rub the leaves and smell your fingers. Depending on the variety, you will discover a lemon flavour (which is quite edible), rose, mint, or any number of interesting scents.

Speaking of 'flavours'

it is possible to turn an otherwise dull and boring space in your garden into a lemon. Look for lemon scented geraniums, lemon basil, lemon mint and the most intense lemon-scented plant, the lemon verbena, which is always a winner in a sunny position. Drop a few leaves into a cold drink, including iced water, to make it more interesting. Shredded leaves work nicely in salads, but test them by munching on a leaf or two before you serve them to guests. The intensity of flavour varies from plant to plant, the time of day that you pick the leaves (mid day the flavour peaks) and the degree of dryness at the time of picking.

The mint family provides one of the best opportunities to grow a scented garden that is consumable. Look for spearmint, peppermint, and just plain old mint. Even cat mint (otherwise known as catnip) can be planted for an unusual but strong and distinct scent in the garden. Monarda (Bee Balm), which is a member of the mint family, makes great tea when you use the leaves and the flowers. It is reportedly good for you too. This is evidently true

for all mints. I wouldn't know from first hand experience as I am a coffee drinker, but my 3 daughters keep the tea companies in business, I swear. They have tried them all and tell me each has their own distinct flavour. I will have to take their word for it.

#### Shrubs that Smell Good

Don't overlook the winter hardy flowering shrubs that produce a prodigiously powerful punch. Fragrant Viburnum is well named (early spring), lilacs are famous for their air borne scent (I like the French hybrids best) and double mockorange will not disappoint in the scent department.

#### By Any other Name, not as Sweet

At one time roses were famous for their scent. A century ago most roses carried a scent that was distinct and highly sought after. The hybridizers got their hands on them and started monkeying with the old fashioned qualities of roses in an effort to make them bloom more heavily, to resist disease and insects, and to make them more suitable for cutting and shipping. They also succeeded in breeding out the pleasant scent of most modern roses. That is, until David

Austin, a Brit, came along and bred the scent back in. The results have made him world famous. If he hasn't been knighted, he ought to be.

Now we have rose varieties like Abraham Darby and Bosobel that are fully double and heavy with the scent of heaven. Ask for them at your retailer - and no, it is not too late to plant roses. Nursery growers produce them in large pots using specially prepared compost mix that allows us to plant them right through the summer months.

I might add that my favourite rose for cutting and for fragrance is Double Delight - a fabulously floriferous (a word that I made up to describe this beauty) grandiflora that you can find at any self respecting garden centre. Unless they are sold out, of course.

I would not recommend that you design a garden strictly with scent and touching in mind, but it would be a good place to start if you wish to turn your garden into more than just a pretty picture.

# Farm Field Dinner back for third serving

Lennox and Addington's gorgeous night skies and farm fresh produce will again be combined to create a unique dining experience, as the Farm Field Gourmet Dinner returns on Aug. 23.

Back for a third year, the outdoor dinner will feature local meat, produce and wines.

"It's always great to be able to highlight local foods and local farmers," said Stephen Paul, L&A County's Manager of Economic Development and event

organizer. "That's really what these dinners are all about."

Throughout the six-course meal, guests will be informed as to which farms supplied the various ingredients.

"All the feedback has been wonderful," Paul says of the food suppliers for the first two events. "I think the farming community and our growers certainly appreciate an event that can highlight what they're doing. awareness of the great things that are produced here in L&A."

Looking after the meal will be chef Eunice Champlin. With over 30 years experience in the business, she currently operates Blanche Dubois at Elysian Fields bed-and-breakfast in Napanee.

"The menu is made but I may change some things because of availability," said Champlin.

She says she'll be in contact with farmers as the event draws nearer, making sure to use farm fresh ingredients that are in season.

"I'm certainly looking forward to it because it will include lots of farmers who are growing some unique vegetables," she said. "We'll try to showcase them as much as possible. The meats are all coming from the county, and they'll be a variety from pheasant to duck to beef."

Wines will be provided by Thirty Three Vines and Bergeron Estates Winery and Cider Company, both local wineries found just east of Adolphustown on Hwy. 33.

Providing the backdrop for the dinner is Oliver Farm, which is located at

9280 County Rd. 2, just west of Napanee. Giant tables will be set up in the field, with a tent covering it to provide shade.

"This year's location is unique because it's in a field of soybeans but it's also right on the Napanee River," said Paul. "We think it speaks a lot about the beauty of L&A."

Each year they've held the dinner in a different farm field to further highlight the uniqueness of the many farms in the area. In 2010 it was held at McPherson Farm and in 2011 Paulridge Berry Farm played host. The weather

co-operated on both occasions and they're hoping for a third straight clear-sky night.

Tickets have always sold out for the event and they're well on their way again this year. There are 100 seats available, but they are filling up quickly.

"Because we're already getting calls about it, we expect tickets to go fast," said Paul. "So if you're interested in going, we encourage you to act quickly."

# Toronto-based singer brings talents to Yarker

These days, singer-songwriter Amy Campbell is riding a very positive wave.

The Toronto-based folk artist, who is in the process of releasing her third CD this month, is headlining the latest installment of the Riverside concert series in Yarker on July 28.

The concert will come just four days after her newest album, *Letters Homes*, becomes available. Though she's proud of the work she'd done in the past, Campbell is particularly stoked about her latest effort. "It's very exciting. It's really nice to have something that, on every level, I'm so happy with. I'm happy with the sound, and I'm happy with the people I'm working with. I'm thrilled. I'm happy with the way it looks. It just feels really, really good."

Part of her enthusiasm might stem from the fact that she worked alongside a number of accomplished artists and musicians, not the least of which was producer Don Kerr, who himself has collaborated with artists like The Rheostatics and Ron Sexsmith.

"I am all the lucky there is," replies Campbell with a laugh when asked about working with the likes of Kerr. "Working with Don was amazing, and I can't say enough good about it."

Campbell admits she was somewhat nervous about the collaboration, having heard horror stories of female artists having their work "paved over" in the production process. Campbell says she quickly discovered that wouldn't be her experience. "It was very much about taking out what was special about that individual songwriter and elevating it and supporting it and adding to it,"

she says. "It was very much about everybody doing what they're best at, and making this 'soup' together. It just really worked."

Campbell — who was born and raised in Newfoundland before moving to Halifax as a teenager — says she has drawn from various influences in her musical development, from Canadian singer-songwriters like Joni Mitchell and Gordon Lightfoot to,

perhaps unexpectedly, the 'AM radio' ballads of the late 1980s and early 1990s.

"Around the time I was starting to play guitar, I was listening to a lot of Sarah McLachlan," she adds. "I listened to a lot of Ani DiFranco — I learned to play guitar by copying Ani DiFranco. She plays in a lot of alternate tunings. I learned to play her songs, and I felt very influenced by that."

Perhaps that influence has rubbed off. Cindy Filipenko of *Herizons* magazine boldly predicted that Campbell would "inherit

Joni Mitchell's place as Canada's quintessential female singer-songwriter."

"I take that as a huge compliment," Campbell says, who adds that while that kind of praise comes with a challenge, it's a challenge she prepared to take on.

"I'm up for it. If it's going to keep me honest and keep me focused, that's a good thing."

Local music buffs will get a chance to hear for themselves at Riverside United Church on July 28. Campbell — who will be accompanied by Carlie Howell on upright bass and Glenn Austin on percussion — says she'll play some songs from new album, as well as some of her older tunes.
