"I do know we have people coming from Nova Scotia and British Columbia," said Pavel 'Bear' Mokros, member of the Juno Unit CAV and event organizer. "The ones coming from across Canada are all from the Canadian Army Veterans, but there are also many local clubs that are also going to show up."

Not everyone in the CAV served their country though, as civilian supporters of the group are welcome. "We come from all walks of life," said Mokros. "It was started by veterans to support veterans. (The club includes veterans) right from Second World War dispatch riders to current 20-year-olds that got into the military this year."

Some of the classic bikes that will be on hand will have been used in military service.

Money from registration as well as 'biker games' that will take place at the Strathcona Paper Centre will go towards ICROSS Canada, Children's Wish and L&A's Interval House. ICROSS Canada assists the poorest of the poor living in Africa, Children's Wish helps terminal children live out their dream and Interval House is a local women's shelter.

Riders will arrive on the afternoon of Aug. 3 for a meet and greet, camp at the SPC and then hit the road Saturday morning. The first ride, in support of Children's Wish, will go from 9:30-11:30 a.m. throughout the county. During that time they'll hold a show-and-shine at the arena before departing on the Interval House ride at 11:30 a.m. The final ride will take place around 4 p.m., with another show-and-shine mixed in. In the evening they'll be treated to live music.

Mokros says it was an e-mail by Lennox and Addington Economic Officer Rob Plumley that first drew him to the area. Given the county's long stretches of open road, scenic routes and variety of curves and hills, it's the perfect spot for motorcycle rallies. In the last couple of years the county has promoted itself as an ideal spot for riders and word is starting to spread. Closer look at 'tactile gardens'

"I know that if odour were visible, as colour is, I'd see the summer garden in rainbow clouds.

~Robert Bridges, Testament of Beauty

Dinner is only 30 minutes away and I have not thought about food for the briefest moment. I brush a naked hand through a rosemary plant sitting in a container on the back patio and instantly I can hardly wait for a plate full of food. What just happened is not a miracle; it is a common, everyday experience during the gardening season that is generally taken for granted.

Whether it is appetite stimulation, clearing the sinuses with a whiff of menthol scented mint, or enjoying the feel of a Lamb's Ear on the skin of your finger tips, the results always generate a heightened sense of the green, growing world around you. Indeed, we do take many plants for granted.

Instead of leaving these tactile encounters in the garden to chance, I have another suggestion. Why not intentionally place scented plants and plants that beg you to reach out and touch them in your garden scheme?

Best Place

Create a garden space nearest the area that you enjoy sitting or areas where you frequent in the garden. The essential oils of rosemary and lavender are activated when you walk past and brush against them. plants provide an abundance of scent without any help from you.

Old fashioned nicotine, heliotrope and stocks, can provide an almost overwhelming scent in the garden or on the porch and patio when planted in containers. This is especially true in the evenings when the air is quiet and the plants release their scent in an attempt to attract night flying pollinators.

Allow your flowering, highly scented plants to become dry and the perfume that they produce is intensified further. Planting against a sunny. south-facing wall increases the intensity of the scents. Conversely I recommend that you avoid planting scented annuals and perennials in the shade, which minimizes the scent that they pro-

Different plants produce nectar that is highly scented at different times of the year. Early in spring I plant hyacinths near the entrance to our home to greet us with a scent that says, "Hello spring!". This time of year my Confederate Jasmine,

gardenia, and honeysuckle flowers provide the same, warm greeting.

Touch me!

When you were a child, perhaps you can remember being told to touch a rather innocuous, finely leafed tropical plant that curled up its' leaves when you ran your fingers over them. It was fun and it gave us a basic understanding that plants

indeed have their own sensitivities. The plant

was mimosa and it is easy to grow outdoors this time of year as a tropical. It is not nearly as attractive as it is fun. Introduce your kids or grand children to it and watch for the reac-

Other plants that beg to be touched include Lamb's Ears (stachys), a reliable perennial (zone 4) that produces lots of yellow flowers in the spring and an abundance of soft, smooth, furry leaves that feel just like the ears of a lamb.

Scented geraniums tempt you to rub the leaves and smell your fingers. Depending on the variety, you will discover a lemon flavour (which is quite edible), rose, mint, or any number of interesting scents.

Speaking of 'flavours'

it is possible to turn an otherwise dull and boring space in your garden into a lemon. Look for lemon scented geraniums, lemon basil, lemon mint and the most intense lemon-scented plant, the lemon verbena, which is always a winner in a sunny position. Drop a few leaves into a cold drink, including iced water, to make it more interesting. Shredded leaves work nicely in sal-

ads, Mark Cullen test them by munch-**Green File** ing on a leaf or two before you serve them to

but

guests. The intensity of flavour varies from plant to plant, the time of day that you pick the leaves (mid day the flavour peaks) and the degree of dryness at the time of picking.

The mint family provides one of the best opportunities to grow a scented garden that is consumable. Look for spearmint, peppermint, and just plain old mint. Even cat mint (otherwise known as catnip) can be planted for an unusual but strong and distinct scent in the garden. Monarda (Bee Balm), which is a member of the mint family, makes great tea when you use the leaves and the flowers. It is reportedly good for you too. This is evidently true

for all mints. I wouldn't know from first hand experience as I am a coffee drinker, but my 3 daughters keep the tea companies in business, I swear. They have tried them all and tell me each has their own distinct flavour. I will have to take their word for

Shrubs that Smell Good

Don't overlook the winter hardy flowering shrubs that produce a prodigiously powerful punch. Fragrant Viburnum is well named (early spring), lilacs are famous for their air borne scent (I like the French hybrids best) and double mockorange will not disappoint in the scent department.

By Any other Name, not as Sweet

At one time roses were famous for their scent. A century ago most roses carried a scent that was distinct and highly sought after. The hybridizers got their hands on them and started monkeying with the old fashioned qualities of roses in an effort to make them bloom more heavily, to resist disease and insects, and to make them more suitable for cutting and shipping. They also succeeded in breeding out the pleasant scent of most modern roses. That is, until David

Austin, a Brit, came along and bred the scent back in. The results have made him world famous. If he hasn't been knighted, he ought to be.

Now we have rose varieties like Abraham Darby and Boscobel that are fully double and heavy with the scent of heaven. Ask for them at your retailer - and no, it is not too late to plant roses. Nursery growers produce them in large pots using specially prepared compost mix that allows us to plant them right through the summer months.

I might add that my favourite rose for cutting and for fragrance is Double Delight — a fabulously floriforous (a word that I made up to describe this beauty) grandiflora that you can find at any self respecting garden centre. Unless they are sold out,

I would not recommend that you design a garden strictly with scent and touching in mind, but it would be \bar{a} good place to start if you wish to turn vour garden into more than just a pretty picture.

"The menu is made but I may change some things because of availability," said Champlin.

She says she'll be in contact with farmers as the even draws nearer, making sure to use farm fresh ingredients that are in season. "I'm certainly looking forward to it because it will include lots of farmers who are growing some unique vegetables," she said. "We'll try to showcase them as much as possible. The meats are all coming from the county, and they'll be a variety from pheasant to duck to beef."

Wines will be provided by Thirty Three Vines and Bergeron Estates Winery and Cider Company, both local wineries found just east of Adolphustown on Hwy. 33.

Providing the backdrop for the dinner is Oliver Farm, which is located at 9280 County Rd. 2, just west of Napanee. Giant tables will be set up in the field, with a tent covering it to provide shade.

"This year's location is unique because it's in a field of soybeans but it's also right on the Napanee River," said Paul. "We think it speaks a lot about the beauty of L&A."

Each year they've held the dinner in a different farm field to further highlight the uniqueness of the many farms in the area. In 2010 it was held at McPherson Farm and in 2011 Paulridge Berry Farm played host. The weather co-operated on both occasions and they're hoping for a third straight clear-sky night.

Tickets have always sold out for the event and they're well on their way again this year. There are 100 seats available, but they are filling up quickly.
